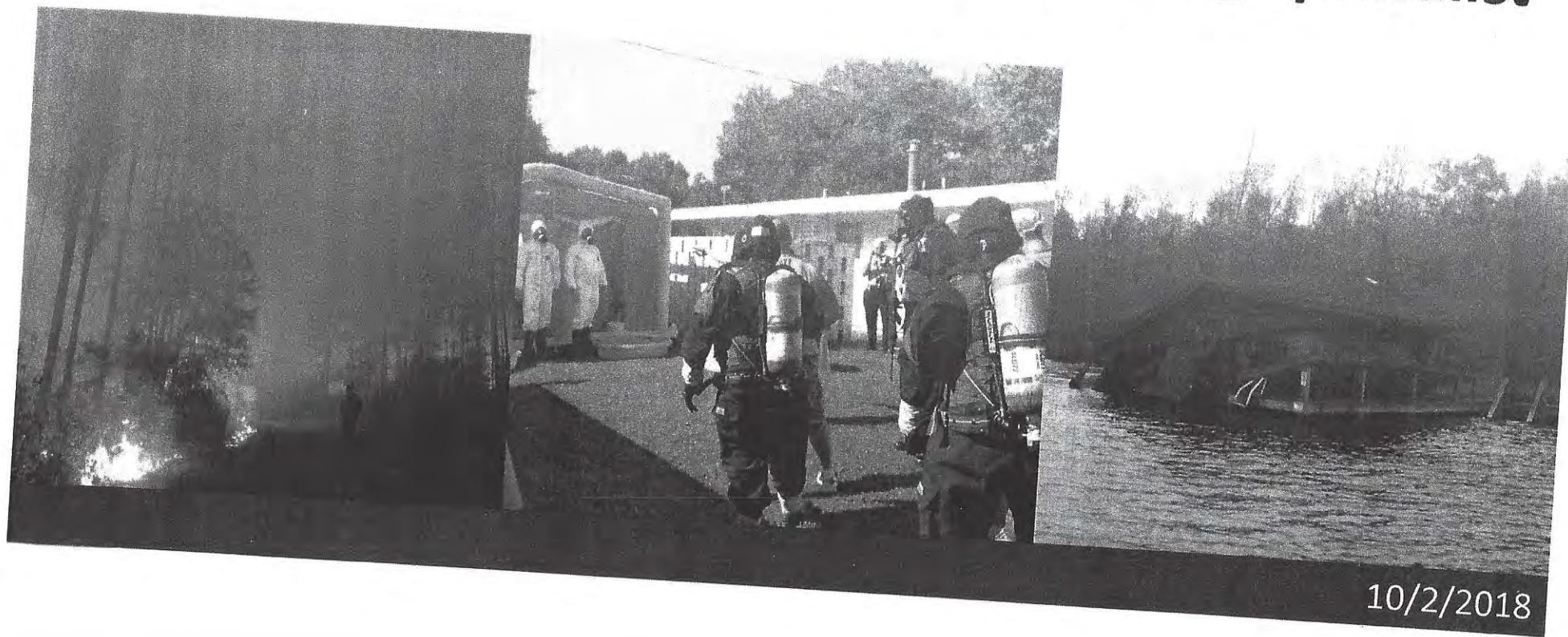

Why are we doing this?

Required for Federal Grant Eligibility

- The Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 (DMA2K) requires a local plan to be in place in order to be eligible for grant funding opportunities.
 - Emphasizes a proactive approach to emergency management – prevent damages before the disaster
- These include:
 - Pre-Disaster Mitigation Competitive Grants (PDM-C)
 - Flood Mitigation Assistance Grants (FMA)
 - Post-Disaster Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP)
 - One of the first questions you will be asked: "Do you have a hazard mitigation plan?"

Ok. We have a plan. So, why are we doing this?

Hazard Mitigation Plans are required by Federal law to be updated every 5 years

- Carroll County's plan was approved on **August 1, 2016**
- Carroll County's plan will expire on **July 31, 2021**

What does this plan do?

- **Identify the Hazard**
 - Tornadoes, floods, lightning, earthquakes, etc.
 - Natural disasters are required.
 - Can also include technological, or man-made hazards (FEMA will not look at these, however it can be beneficial to the county to include these in the plan for mitigation purposes.)
- **Determine the Risk (Threat)**
 - A real, quantifiable number that is based on past hazard history, or advanced statistical modeling
- **Determine the Vulnerability**
 - How bad could the damages get? (dollars, numbers, etc.)
- **Develop goals & projects to reduce the risk &/or vulnerability**

- **Organize Resources**
 - Determine who needs to be part of the process
 - Identify resources for information
- **Update Risk Assessment**
 - What new hazards have occurred since the completion of the previous plan?

Changes

- **Planning Process**
 - Must include documentable opportunities for participation from neighboring communities (surrounding counties) in the planning process.
 - Can be accomplished through email invites.
 - Must include two documentable opportunities for public participation during drafting stage & to comment on final draft prior to adoption
 - Can be public hearings, website notices, etc.
- **Risk Assessment**
 - NFIP repetitive loss structures vulnerability must be described in terms of types and numbers of structures.
- **Goals & Objectives**
 - Must be strategy for NFIP compliance spelled out, or a specific statement of why jurisdiction is not going to participate in program

Important Grant Requirements

Carroll County's Plan

Hazard Mitigation Plan Updates have special requirements according to your award

- Initial draft is due **December 31, 2019**
- Grant deadline is **June 30, 2020**
- Quarterly progress reports due at the end of each quarter
- **Key Point:** *The above dates are not related to the expiration date of the current plan.*

- **County Point of Contact**
 - Submit quarterly reports on time
 - Submit for reimbursement as needed
 - Coordinate the planning process and write the plan
- **County, Cities & Towns**
 - Participate in planning process & adopt plan
 - County will invite all municipalities to participate in the planning process
 - Participation & adoption of the plan is YOUR responsibility
- **Everyone**
 - Will ensure your input into the planning process & into identified goals & objectives
 - Will help the County meet the **15%** grant match requirement

imprisonment. He and four other Georgia residents have been accused of defrauding retirees of their Veterans and Social Security benefits, according to an indictment order.

Federal authorities have identified Rockcliff Burchell, a resident of Montego Bay, Jamaica, and accused him of

obtaining personal identity information of the victims and contacting the Department of Veterans Affairs and the Social Security Administration.

They said he then allegedly used the information to gain access to the victims' Veterans and Social Security Accounts, where he is accused of changing the banking information the agencies use to make deposits. The altered banking information allowed for the

benefits to go into the bank accounts of the defendants.

Burchell then allegedly had prepaid debit cards and ATM cards paid for with the stolen money sent to the co-conspirators, including Ricketts in Carroll County. Ricketts is accused of using the cards to withdraw funds at banks and ATM machines.

The case is set for a criminal jury trial in Fort Lauderdale, Florida, which is scheduled to begin Jan. 21, 2020.

Emergency plan for county getting an update

The Carroll County Emergency Management Agency is updating its plan to handle major hazards facing the area, from flooding to storms and winter weather.

The plan addresses the aforementioned events that have the highest frequency of occurrence in the county.

But it also addresses low-risk scenarios, including tropical cyclones and even earthquakes.

"It outlines all of the hazards and how the county could potentially be hit by a disaster, and we are looking at ways to mitigate those disasters," said Amy Goolsby, Carroll County EMA planner.

Participants in updating the near-

ly 200-page plan include the Carroll County Board of Commissioners, Community Development, E-911, Public Works, Fire Rescue and Sheriff's Office.

Using "how-to" guides from FEMA, the hazard mitigation plan steering committee put together a natural

of the lawsuit brought by Carroll County related to construction of the Carroll County Judicial Center and renovation of the Historic Courthouse, it only identified J&R Construction and Development, the general contractor on the job, as the party against whom the county filed suit. By way of clarification, the county's lawsuit also asserted claims against eight other entities. This included the two architectural firms for the project, against whom the county alleged defective design of certain elements of the project contributed to leaks and other failures in the buildings. The county's lawsuit further asserted claims against six subcontractors who performed work on the project. All nine of the entities sued by the county denied the claims asserted against them, and raised numerous defenses, including defenses related to certain actions or inactions on the part of the county. With no entity admitting or acknowledging responsibility, the parties worked together to resolve the lawsuit. Carroll County Chairman Miche Morgan stated, "I am very thankful to J&R Construction Co., the general contractor, and Alex Roush, the architect, for working with all of the subcontractors to resolve this case."



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Emergency plan for county getting an update

The Carroll County Emergency Management Agency is updating its plan to handle major hazards facing the area, from flooding to storms and winter weather.

The plan addresses the aforementioned events that have the highest frequency of occurrence in the county. But it also addresses low-risk scenarios, including tropical cyclones and even earthquakes.

"It outlines all of the hazards and how the county could potentially be hit by a disaster, and we are looking at ways to mitigate those disasters," said Amy Goolsby, Carroll County EMA planner.

Participants in updating the nearly 200-page plan include the Carroll County Board of Commissioners, Community Development, E-911, Public Works, Fire Rescue and Sheriff's Office.

Using "how-to" guides from FEMA, the hazard mitigation plan steering committee put together a natural hazard, risk and vulnerability summary. The summary identifies a variety of hazards and their effects on the community and its resources.

Severe storms are the most common of the natural hazards in the county because they have the capability to cause widespread property and crop damage, injuries and even death.

There have been 28 significant flooding events in Carroll County since 1996 on record at the National Climatic Data Center, according to the hazard plan, resulting in more than \$26 million property damage.

The most significant flood occurred in September 2009, which was described as a 500-year flood. This event received a federal declaration and resulted in approximately \$22.9 million in damage throughout the county.

Carroll County, the Carroll County Water Authority, the county Board of Education and three cities received \$4.9 million in FEMA assistance after this flood.

Historically, according to the hazard plan, there is an 89% chance that a flood will occur in the county each year, and localized flooding is common in Carroll. This is mainly due to flash flooding from storm runoff, causing a rise in creeks over roadways. The streams typically recede without the need for significant repairs.

The plan includes several facets of Carroll County and its cities, ranging from the government's budget to transportation, health care, the Georgia Rail System and public safety. It also reviews existing plans like the comprehensive plan, economic development and stormwater management documents.

All of the municipalities in Carroll County work with the county's EMA and community development department to make updates to the plans and programs that are already in place.

To support emergency management agencies across the country, Congress passed the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000, which deals with the development of local Hazard Mitigation Plans.

Each local government in Georgia must adopt this plan and routinely update the document to stay eligible for federal funding. The plan was last updated in 2016, and the 2020 draft will be approved by the state emergency management agency and FEMA.

FEMA's Pre-Disaster Mitigation Grant Program assists state, local and tribal governments with grants in implement cost-effective hazard mitigation plans, Goolsby said.

A local government can receive funding from the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program to acquire property and enhance structures to minimize damages from natural disasters.

The Carroll County BOC and each city in the county are expected to adopt the new plan in April 2020.

"Hazard Mitigation Plans are essential tools in protecting the public's health, safety and welfare in a disaster," the plan says. "In mitigating the potential effects ahead of time, Carroll County is acting proactively to protect life, safety, property and the environment from natural and technological hazards. As disasters become increasingly expensive, it is vital that the county has the necessary regulations in place to safeguard its interests."

The State of Georgia has been funding the organization for several years, but it appears obvious now that this support has vanished as well.

The committee Officers need to research the situation diligently and decide on the future of the organization. Certainly, more discussion will need to take place. Should the decision to disband be approved, new By-Laws would be written and approved before such a change could take place.

Tim Padgett has been in contact with GEMA about this subject and we are going to wait until the end of the year to consider this further.
