The plan addresses the aforementioned events that have the highest frequency of occurrence in the county. But it also addresses low-risk scenarios, including tropical cyclones and even earthquakes.

"It outlines all of the hazards and how the county could potentially be hit by a disaster, and we are looking at ways to mitigate those disasters," said Amy Goolsby, Carroll County EMA planner.

Participants in updating the nearly 200-page plan include the Carroll County Board of Commissioners, Community Development, E-911, Public Works, Fire Rescue and Sheriff's Office.

Using "how-to" guides from FEMA, the hazard mitigation plan steering committee put together a natural hazard, risk and vulnerability summary. The summary identifies a variety of hazards and their effects on the community and its resources.

Severe storms are the most common of the natural hazards in the county because they have the capability to cause widespread property and crop damage, injuries and even death.

There have been 28 significant flooding events in Carroll County since 1996 on record at the National Climatic Data Center, according to the hazard plan, resulting in more than \$26 million property damage.

The most significant flood occurred in September 2009, which was described as a 500-year flood. This event received a federal declaration and resulted in approximately \$22.9 million in damage throughout the county.

Carroll County, the Carroll County Water Authority, the county Board of Education and three cities received \$4.9 million in FEMA assistance after this flood.

Historically, according to the hazard plan, there is an 89% chance that a flood will occur in the county each year, and localized flooding is common in Carroll. This is mainly due to flash flooding from storm runoff, causing a rise in creeks over roadways. The streams typically recede without the need for significant repairs.

The plan includes several facets of Carroll County and its cities, ranging from the government's budget to transportation, health care, the Georgia Rail System and public safety. It also reviews existing plans like the comprehensive plan, economic development and stormwater management documents.

All of the municipalities in Carroll County work with the county's EMA and community development department to make updates to the plans and programs that are already in place.

To support emergency management agencies across the country, Congress passed the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000, which deals with the development of local Hazard Mitigation Plans.

ch local government in Georgia must adopt this plan and routinely update the document to stay eligible for federal funding. The plan was last updated in 2016, and the 2020 draft will be approved by the state emergency management agency and FEMA.

FEMA's Pre-Disaster Mitigation Grant Program assists state, local and tribal governments with grants in implement cost-effective hazard mitigation plans, Goolsby said.

A local government can receive funding from the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program to acquire property and enhance structures to minimize damages from natural disasters.

The Carroll County BOC and each city in the county are expected to adopt the new plan in April 2020.

"Hazard Mitigation Plans are essential tools in protecting the public's health, safety and welfare in a disaster," the plan says. "In mitigating the potential effects ahead of time, Carroll County is acting proactively to protect life, safety, property and the environment from natural and technological hazards. As disasters become increasingly expensive, it is vital that the county has the necessary regulations in place to safeguard its interests."




How concerned are you about loss of life or property from a dam fail





#### **Old Business:**

Tim gave an update from the recent LEPC State Conference, the main topic of which was that the State of Georgia has announced that it will no longer fund the LEPC's.

The lack of funding topic started a conversation about disbanding the West Georgia Regional LEPC and replacing it with a Carroll County Resource Committee, or some similar title. The title is unimportant, but it would have to be chartered by the Carroll County Commission. I believe most at this meeting think that this would be a Carroll County Organization and no longer would represent the 3 counties currently in the West Georgia Regional LEPC.

The LEPC in its current form is heavily regulated by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and as a strictly volunteer organization, we are powerless to protect ourselves from these statutes. These statutes are in place, and we as an LEPC have obligations placed upon us, yet the EPA provides the committee with little if any support. The State of Georgia has been funding the organization for several years, but it appears obvious now that this support has vanished as well.

The committee Officers need to research the situation diligently and decide on the future of the organization. Certainly, more discussion will need to take place. Should the decision to disband be approved, new By-Laws would be written and approved before such a change could take place.

Tim Padgett has been in contact with GEMA about this subject and we are going to wait until the end of the year to consider this further.

UPDATE - No update given this meeting.

#### New Business:

No Treasurers Report given.

The election of the 2019 LEPC officers was held. Greg McKibben made a motion on the below mentioned offices; Robert Morgan seconded the motion. The motion carried with no opposition.

Danny Fowler – Chair Tim Padgett – Co Chair Jodie Prater – Secretary Ken Thompson – Treasurer

A Severe Weather (Natural Disaster) presentation was given by Tim Padgett. Severe weather is the #1 threat in our area. A "When Disaster Strikes" booklet was given out. Carroll County weather sirens are now zoned. Area sirens only go off if an actual threat is in your area. All Carroll County schools have been given a "Go" bag to use during emergencies. Tim encouraged everyone to have a weather radio.

Robert Morgan brought up the topic of notifications required for an RQ (Reportable Quantity) spill. Remember an RQ spill is required to be reported to your local LEPC, the National Response Center, and EPA all within 15 minutes. Tim stated to report an RQ spill to the LEPC you can call (770) 830-5882 or (770) 830-5913. The recommendation was made to have someone from EPA come and give a presentation on RQ spills.

Ken Thompson spoke about Pre-Incident Planning. He stated that fire officials are willing to come out and tour your facility and talk to you about pre-incident planning. Please contact Brian Shadrix to schedule if interested.

Tim stated that the county is still working on a Hazard Mitigation Plan that will be submitted to the State. If anyone knows of anything that should be added to the Plan, please contact Amy Goolsby.

Our next meeting is tentatively scheduled for June 13th, 2019. The place and time will be determined.
